Background

The Alberta Elder Abuse Awareness Council (AEAAC) is a council made up of individuals or individuals representing organizations with a mandate to address elder abuse. The Council is committed to increasing awareness and supporting a community response to elder abuse across Alberta. Our shared vision is that all Albertans understand elder abuse and are aware of and have access to resources to address it.

Position Purpose

The purpose of this role is to support the INR:NFF initiative of the Council. This key position will lead projects, promote and market the INR:NFF program and activities in Alberta. The successful candidate will maintain strong communication links with key stakeholders across Alberta.

Duties and Responsibilities

- Coordinate the It's Not Right: Neighbours, Friends, and Family initiative on behalf of the AEAAC
- Host the INR: NFF Conference Calls with trainers and presenters
- Connect regularly with INR:NFF trainers and presenters
- Distribute, collect, and compile INR:NFF surveys
- Determine additional resources and support needed to keep growing INR: NFF
- Develop an adaptable business model to make the INR:NFF initiative sustainable
- Provide regional connection, training, and support for INR:NFF
- Plan a recognition program for NFF
- Raise awareness of the INR:NFF initiative
- Connect regularly and work closely with the Council Development Specialist
- All other duties as assigned.

Minimum Qualifications

- A Diploma or Degree in a Human Services or related field
- Training as a Train-the-Trainer for the It's Not Right: Neighbours, Friends, and Family initiative.
- An understanding of abuse against older adults and experience working with older adults and/or in the family violence sector.
- An understanding and experience with community development practices.
- Excellent written and verbal communication skills, including effective public speaking skills.
- Some awareness of ethnic diversity issues.

• Working knowledge of technology (computer skills, web-based communication methods, and other electronic devices).

Preferred Qualifications

- Knowledge of current elder abuse programs and services in Alberta.
- Experience with facilitation.

Outcomes for this position will include:

- Presenters and Trainers will feel valued, supported, and equipped to provide INR:NFF presentations and training
- A community of practice for the INR:NFF has been established
- There is greater awareness in Alberta of the INR:NFF initiative and the by-standers role in addressing elder abuse

This is a 0.5 FTE (based on approximately 20 hours/week) contract position worth \$15,000.00, that offers flexible hours, work from home and some travel across the province is required.
